Four of Your Best For August 2026 Light and Shadow

An Introduction to
Light and Shadow

“This month we explore how light shapes form, mood, and meaning.”



“Here are some good challenge suggestions for you!”

- Find a strong shadow – something bold with a clear edge.
- Capture a silhouette – simple outline, bright foreground
- Use back-light – let the edge glow.
- Tell a story with shadows – a shadow interacting with a real subject.
- Create an abstract light study – patterns, texture, or pure shapes.

Mix and match any of these challenges with the Four Main Categories of the August Challenge:

- Human World.
- Natural World.
- Close-up
- Monochrome

Cathedral Close Photo Challenge Sheet

This challenge sheet is designed to help photographers explore the diverse lighting conditions and architectural features of Norwich Cathedral Close. Participants can **submit up to five images** that best capture the themes outlined below.

Challenge Categories

- 1. Soft Light** - Capture the gentle, diffused light found in shaded areas or cloisters. Look for even illumination and subtle textures.
- 2. Hard Light** - Photograph scenes with strong, direct sunlight that creates sharp shadows and high contrast. Ideal for graphic compositions.
- 3. Side Light** - Use angled light to highlight textures and depth. Cloister corridors and long walls are perfect for this category.
- 4. Backlight** - Experiment with shooting towards the light source to create silhouettes, rim-light, or atmospheric effects.
- 5. Architectural Details** - Focus on the intricate stonework, arches, and carvings that define the Cathedral Close.
- 6. Shapes and Patterns** - Find repeating shapes, lines, and patterns in the architecture or natural surroundings.
- 7. People in the Close** - Capture candid or posed shots of people interacting with the space, emphasizing scale and atmosphere.
- 8. Seasonal Atmosphere** - Showcase how the Close changes with the seasons - whether it's lush greenery, autumn leaves, or winter light.

Submission Guidelines -- Submit up to five images. Ensure each image corresponds to one of the categories above.
